What is Recreational Therapy?

Recreational therapy is a systematic process that utilizes recreation and other activity-based interventions to address the assessed needs of individuals with illnesses and/or disabling conditions, as a means to psychological and physical health, recovery and well-being.*

What is the CTRS Credential?

The Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist® (CTRS) credential offered through NCTRC represents the benchmark of quality recreational therapy services and is the indicator of the most qualified provider within the field of recreational therapy.



FACTS ABOUT NCTRC CERTIFICATION AND THE CTRS CREDENTIAL

- The eligibility process to become a CTRS includes completion of the required academic coursework, professional experience, and a passing score on the NCTRC certification exam.
- NCTRC certification standards are based on the knowledge and skills necessary for practice within a wide range of service sectors, as verified by national job analysis research.
- Only individuals who have met the specific qualifications to become certified by NCTRC can use the CTRS designation.
- Federal agencies, national and international regulatory and accreditation organizations recognize the CTRS as the benchmark credential for recreational therapists.
- The CTRS credential indicates to employers and the public that the individual has met the requirements necessary to be certified through NCTRC as a qualified provider of recreational therapy services.
